21. Improvements in the library services:

Library provides a congenial atmosphere for reading and research work. Our library subscribes to various journals and magazines in print as well as electronic format. The library has a good collection of books, print journals, periodicals, magazines and newspapers. The college also subscribes to electronic resources through UGC INFLIBNET NLIST Programme where users can access to more than 6000+ journals and 31,35,000+ e-books. The library has a good collection of non-book materials too. Research Journal section provides an appropriate environment for literature survey and research review.

Access to library software KOHA facilitates the search service of entire library collection with various search fields like author, title, publisher, subject headings, etc. Library work is obligatory for the students. In the library both lending and reference facilities are available. There are some library rules to follow strictly. However well-trained and helpful library staff help in efficient working of the library. Reprographic facility is available to students and staff at the library.
